**Resolution No. 175: Legion Should Not Consider Controversial Matters Affecting  
Several States**

**RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in San Antonio, Texas, October 8, 9, 10, 11, 1928, That controversial matters affecting the rights of several states should not be made a subject of resolution by National Conventions of this organization; and, be it finally**

**RESOLVED, That the prestige, which the Legion has earned in the national affairs of our country has come through adherence to fixed aims and ideals and that this prestige must never be used, nor its use attempted, in the furtherance of legislation, not vital to the Legion or to its principles, and concerning which there is, and must be of necessity, wide differences of opinion as any other policy will result in the various departments becoming involved in serious and needless difficulties.**
