Resolution No. 522: Naturalization

RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in Boston, Massachusetts, October 6, 7, 8, 9, 1930, That any veteran of the World War having served with honor for any time between April 6, 1917 and November 11, 1918 under the Stars and Stripes of America and possessing an honorable discharge from the Army, Navy or Marine Corps of the United States and subsequently not having been convicted in any country of a crime, upon finding himself outside of the United States may upon application return to the United States non quota upon condition that such veteran within 90 days from re-entry to the U. S. A. shall apply for naturalization; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That no disabled veteran shall be barred from entry by reason of any physical condition resulting from his service in the World War.
