Resolution No. 229: Creation of a Women's Auxiliary

WHEREAS, We fully realize the importance of the Women's Auxiliary and hope that soon this organization may be completely perfected in state and nation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in Cleveland, Ohio, September 27, 28, 29, 1920, That a permanent department organization of the Women's Auxiliary shall be effected, and a Convention for that purpose be called, whenever in the opinion of the Department Executive Committee such action is deemed proper; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That when twenty (20) percent, of state departments have organized Auxiliary units, it shall be the duty of the national commander to call a National Convention of the Women's Auxiliary for the purpose of forming a national organization; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That our National Constitution be so amended as to permit, at the First National Convention of the Women's Auxiliary of The American Legion, a change in name, so as to obviate the use of the now unsatisfactory word, "Auxiliary," and to permit such Convention to select any name not now in use by a similar organization.
