**Resolution No. 2: Creation of “Sons of The American Legion Advisory Committee”
Origin: Internal Affairs Commission
Submitted by: Finance Commission
(As Amended)**

WHEREAS, The Sons of The American Legion is an integral and important program of The American Legion and has been since 1932; and

WHEREAS, It is important for the Sons of The American Legion to have concise processes for management purposes; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, on October 6-7, 2021, That the National Executive Committee of The American Legion authorizes the Sons of The American Legion to create a “Sons of The American Legion Advisory Committee,” which reports direct to the Sons of The American Legion Oversight Committee who in turn reports direct to the Internal Affairs Commission; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the purpose of this committee is to discuss issues germane to the Sons of The American Legion and recommend courses of action to the Sons of The American Legion Oversight Committee; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee collects detachment recommendations for Sons of The American Legion national offices and positions and recommends approval of same and year of service to the Sons of The American Legion Oversight Committee; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That said committee will comprise a chairman and four members initially named by The American Legion National Executive Committee, plus the current national commander of the Sons of The American Legion with voice but no vote; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the chairman of the Sons of The American Legion Oversight Committee and The American Legion national adjutant are named as consultants; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That two members shall serve one year, one member shall serve two years, one member shall serve three years, and thereafter, appointments shall be selected annually to serve for a period of three years; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the chairman shall be appointed annually; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That in addition to this advisory committee, The American Legion national commander may appoint from time to time additional consultants who will serve one-year terms; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That appointments to fill members’ expiring terms shall be made annually by the The American Legion National Executive Committee.
