**Resolution No. 9: Rescission of Obsolete Policy Resolutions
Origin: National Economic Commission
Submitted By: National Economic Commission**

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 111, adopted by the 18th National Convention, specifies that policy resolutions shall remain in effect indefinitely unless “changed by subsequent Convention action or by action of the National Executive Committee”; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 759, adopted by the 30th National Convention, specifies that Legislative resolutions expire at the end of each Congress, except that those adopted “at the National Convention or National Executive Committee meeting immediately preceding the convening of a new Congress” are effective until it adjourns; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, on October 14 and 15, 1998, That The American Legion affirms that the resolutions described are considered as having the required action completed for one of the following reasons: (1) the resolution is obsolete; (2) the intent of the resolution has been accomplished by administrative or legislative action; (3) the resolution has been superseded by a later resolution; (4) the resolution is in conflict with existing resolutions; or (5) for other reasons.
