Resolution No. 53: Transfer of a Member of The American Legion From One Post to Another

Origin: Membership & Post Activities Committee Submitted by: Internal Affairs Commission

WHEREAS, Members of The American Legion who are desirous of maintaining their continuous membership record have experience difficulty in effecting transfers from one post to another following changes of residence; and

WHEREAS, It is desirable that a simple, effective and workable transfer procedure be established; and

WHEREAS, The presently existing transfer procedure is dependent upon the cooperation of the adjutant of the post from which transfer is to be made and said post may be dilatory in completing transfer certificates; and

WHEREAS, The Membership & Post Activities Committee has made a study of this problem, including constitutional provisions and previously existing mandates, and has recommended a new transfer procedure; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 2-3, 1962, That a procedure for the transfer of a member in good standing from one post to another post, either in the same or a different department, be authorized, such procedure to permit a post to accept a member as a transfer upon the presentation of acceptable evidence that the transferring member is in fact a member in good standing.
