**Resolution No. 33: American Legion Token to be Placed at Tomb of Unknown Soldier
Origin: California
Submitted By: Convention Committee of Internal Affairs**

WHEREAS, There are many plaques, shields and tokens of appreciation from numerous organizations in the United States and other countries at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at our national capital; and

WHEREAS, The Unknown Soldier is the symbol of the courage and valor of all loyal American servicemen; and

WHEREAS, A careful scrutiny of all the articles of appreciation in 1953 and again in 1954, showed there to be no plaque, shield or token of The American Legion at the tomb; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in Miami, Florida, October 10, 11, 12, 13, 1955, That there be authorized a suitable plaque, shield or token of The American Legion and in honor of our unknown hero to be placed at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, along with other similar plaques.
